The Naked Truth Fire Art Survey Results – Youtopia 2016

These are the results and analysis of three different sets of questions asked of our community each night of the event. This was a highly scientific survey with less than zero percent of error*



Executive Summary:

This was a one-time installation unique to Youtopia 2016 and never to be repeated again by this art team. A fascination with the Truth was inspiration for the piece and drove the minimalist designs of the Poofer and control box. The survey questions were intended to be more thoughtful and scientific in nature but time proved to be a limiting factor. Thursday's questions were written in advance, while Friday's and Saturday's were written the day of, to some degree in reaction to input from the community. In fact, a number of questions and answers were composed by participants external to the core art team. Fifteen different fire sequences were able to be triggered by variable selections of answers to facilitate the sense of a unique flame effect signature for each participant. Well over 200 surveys were conducted and the results are percentages. All analysis provided at the end of each page is nothing more than the opinion of one person. As a team we appreciated the overwhelming positive feedback from the community and had one hell of a time putting on this show. Hopefully the data in the following pages will provide some value. Environmental Impact Statement:


This survey consumed approximately 65 gallons of propane and released roughly 825 pounds of Carbon Dioxide into the atmosphere. A carbon footprint equivalent to driving a modern car across the country and then some. It took 6,346 mature trees to actively offset the CO2 produced by this installation during the event.

Question 1: You have been wandering a barren desert seeking impermanent answers to ancestral questions. 


Analysis: Oddly nobody picked the Turkey for a spirit animal. This is best explained by the seasonal risk associated with being a Turkey right before Thanksgiving. Octopus was an unexpected winner as the community does not seem very reclusive at large.




Analysis: Either 39% of our community are not burners or that option should not have been included in the answers. It is safe to assume the majority of those responses did not know the correct answer. The 18% that selected 'Radical Acceptance' recognized it was not 'Radical Inclusion' and could be considered hard core burners. Clearly the principal of 'Immediacy' is the least understood, yet according to the Burning Man website, "in many ways, the most important touchstone of value in our culture." Recommendation is focusing next year's theme around the principal of Immediacy.

Question 3: You are on a humble raft drifting down a mazy river in a tangled jungle surrounded by uncertainty, allure and conundrum. Your pulse awakens as a decisive fork in the river appears. You recall one fork leads to a gnarly waterfall, while the other leads to a tribe of peaceful vegan artists you intend to study for a year on sabbatical. You lost cell service days ago and google maps is useless, why didn't you bring a paper map!? You notice a crude sign on the riverbank with two arrows and two symbols. The symbol pointing to the right is a cow skull, and the symbol pointing left is a coiled serpent. What do you do?

Results:

Take the RIGHT Fork (Skull)	15%




Analysis: Clearly Kajura (Fire Snake) was more popular than the Moloch (Bull Skull). Assuming some of the survey takers did not notice the adjacent fire art, it is interesting there is a nearly 50/50 split between decisiveness based on no facts vs. going with the flow, or possibly wanting more information.

Question 4: If you could have one of these experiences, which would best describe your perfect moment at Youtopia?

Sharing an amazing connection with a small group of people, followed by deep belly laughs and the	
best group hug you've ever experienced!	37%
A beautiful person approaches you and you both fall in love immediately, followed by the best sex	
of your life. They even look good the next morning!	22%
Walking alone and feeling inspired. You're seeing things in a new way, confidence and clarity	
surround you. Then you have a wonderful epiphany!	17%
Taking this survey right now.	15%
Reconnecting deeply with your longtime spouse or partner and feeling a renewed fiery passion for	
them. Communication barriers have been lifted and you feel complete!	9%




Analysis: The results are self-explanatory and nicely distributed. It is uncertain to what degree those who selected 'Taking this survey right now.' were "living in the moment" vs. attempting to influence the fire show. Among the hard core burners who identified Radical Acceptance as not a Burning Man principal, the results were approximately 30% seeking new love, 20% for group hug, 20% for an epiphany, 20% for reconnecting with a partner, and 10% for taking the survey. Further examination of community members' motivations for attending Youtopia is recommended and may potentially aid the challenge of promoting a culture of consent from the top down.




Analysis: Our community is evenly split between Oxidizing Quarks and Everlasting Old Hard Dicks... Alright Alright Alright.

If I take one more survey, I'm going to die!	7%




Analysis: It is obvious now that seven percent of people who take surveys do not enjoy taking them.








Analysis: The Marshmallow Cult installation was by far the funniest thing at Youtopia. Interactive, Funny, Brilliant.

Never bring another survey to Youtopia	13%



FALSE	17%


